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## GENERAL MASTER OF ARTS IN TEACHING: SECONDARY/ SPECIAL LICENSURE

The outline of the program is as follows:

- Candidates must have completed upon admission to the Graduate School a bachelor's degree in an approved content area from an accredited institution.
- During the first academic year, candidates will take the following professional education courses EDUC 225, EDUC 305, their major department's methods course, EDUC 505L, EDUC 506, EDUC 515L, EDUC 521L, EDUC 527L, EDUC 531, EDUC 542, EDUC 552, LING 531, LING 618, and an additional four-hour Bible/ Theology course from the approved graduate program's Category I listing (https://catalog.wheaton.edu/graduate/academic-policies-information/academic-requirements/); and any coursework to meet licensure deficiencies in their content area.
- During the second year of enrollment, candidates will enroll fulltime fall semester for their student teaching experience (EDUC 587, EDUC 594, plus EDUC 597). With the satisfactory completion of student teaching and the State of Illinois examinations, candidates can apply for State of Illinois teacher licensure.
- Each subsequent semester until an Educational Project is completed candidates must enroll in EDUC 599 and pay the continuation fee.
- The Master of Arts in Teaching degree will be awarded once all degree requirements are complete and the Educational Project is satisfactorily completed.

Requirements for the General Master of Arts in Teaching: Secondary/ Special Licensure degree are 10 hours of possible undergraduate prerequisites and 34 graduate hours including:
