## Additional Options

In addition to a student taking the Humanitarian Action Certificate, here are two ways the certificate can pair with another certificate and/or a master's program.

### 1. For HNGR students who want to pursue a Humanitarian Action Certificate

Students enrolled in the HNGR Certificate can also earn a Humanitarian Action Certificate by fulfilling the following requirements. (Note that the Human Needs and Global Resources (HNGR) Certificate has a separate process for application and admission.)

- Choose 12 credits from the Humanitarian Action core courses above
- Complete all course requirements for the HNGR Certificate (<https://catalog.wheaton.edu/undergraduate/arts-sciences/human-needs-global-resources-hngr/human-needs-global-resources-certificate/>)

### 2. For students wanting to pursue a Humanitarian Action Certificate and the Accelerated MA in Humanitarian and Disaster Leadership

Students can both declare the (undergraduate) Humanitarian Action Certificate and apply for the Accelerated MA program. This requires an additional (simple) application through the Graduate Admissions Office. Accelerated MA students can take a maximum of eight credit hours of graduate courses per semester (and a maximum of 16 credits total) and can apply cross-listed HDI graduate level courses to the Humanitarian Action Certificate.
